Social Emotional Learning is Self-awareness, Responsible decision-making, Relationship skills, social awareness, and self-management.

5 Focus

5 movements, jumping jacks, Arm Circles, Squats, Push-ups, and Deep Breath With images of the movement so students can see. Review with students so they understand the movements.

Food scarcity and Soup bowls project. Glazed dollar store bowls with stroke and coat bowls to bring awareness of the Food Scarcity in their own region.

Students watch teachers and their actions can unintentionally model unempathetic behavior.

- Eye-roll after a fellow art teacher/student makes a comment.
- Dismissing what another teacher/student says in earshot of students models a mindset that lacks empathy
- Being sarcastic.

Empathetic Sentence Starters

- Gather information
 - Would/could you tell me a little more?
- 2) Clarify understanding
 - Let me see if I have this right?
- 3) Model Listening
 - I see that you are feeling (emotion).
- 4) Affirm Feelings
