Happy New Year to all!

As we start the new year, I'd like to welcome the new board members beginning their terms in January. There are also several new members to the Executive Committee. Following the November elections, Sarah Danner was selected as President Elect and Randy Robart, First Vice President. Secretary Sue Ayers has stepped down to serve as the new State Conference Chair and

Jan Fedorenko has agreed to complete the rest of her term through 2010.

In keeping with the spirit of the season I'd like to take this opportunity to reflect on our successes in 2009 and the challenges facing us for 2010. Our accomplishments in 2009 include the following:

- * A pilot program designed by the Georgann Blair and Laura Tawil (NE) on Gifted Education Identification (initiated April 2009). Another workshop was hosted by the Western region in Dayton October 2009.
- * Dates set for future state conferences: November 4-6, 2010 (Columbus); November 10-12, 2011 (Dayton); November 8-10, 2012 (Greater Cincinnati). Revamp of OAEA website began with a user survey distributed to gain input from membership.
- * Advocacy plan developed by PR/Advocacy Committee (May 2009).
- * Financial Planning/Accounting/Budget and Conference Planning process
- * A member survey conducted to aid program planning.
- * Continuation of Youth Art Month activities such as the YAM and YPAE
- * Continued to recognize members through the Awards program.
- * Congratulations to all of the 2009 recipients, especially our Ohio Art Educator of the Year Dennis Cannon.
- * Successful regional activities took place around the state.
- * Continued publication of Artline.
- * Continued to provide professional develop through the annual conference.

The Cleveland Conference gave us an opportunity to try a number of new strategies to provide the best art education professional development opportunity in our state. Kristin Walker, Conference Coordinator worked with the local committee to develop a program designed to reach out to our youngest and most veteran members. We worked very hard to reduce the cost of the conference (by \$85 for early bird) along with incentives such as providing a reduced registration for teachers that volunteered to be workshop presenters. The conference program was a great success, but it fell short financially.

The OAEA is not unlike other businesses and organizations experiencing financial challenges in these tough economic times. At the January board meeting the executive committee shared the 2009 year-end statement and projections for 2010 with the board. To make up for losses from the Cleveland conference we have had to greatly reduce the budget for 2010 and seek ways to increase income. Our primary source of income comes from membership and conference fees so the board agreed to increases in both areas. The OAEA has not raised dues in over 15 years and a modest increase will help the organization continue to provide excellent service for our membership. More information on this will be available later on the website. Should you have any questions, please feel free to contact me directly. With your support and these financial adjustments, I look forward to a successful 2010.

When a Northeast Region art teacher walks in to Case Western Reserve Art's Building to drop off their YAM artwork the woman they meet is a kind, gentle and humble Jenn Thompson. Jenn is our NE Region YAM Chair, and has been for many years as well as one of our OAT's. She is often found working behind the scenes at many NE Region events and is always willing to jump in when needed, no matter what the task. In recognition of Jenn's contributions to OAEA the NE Region would like to present her to you as our teacher feature.

Jenn has been teaching for 15 years in the Solon School System at the elementary level. In Jenn's own words her teaching philosophy is as follows:

"Inspiring the students to be great thinkers has been my philosophy for the past fifteen years. The aspect of teaching that came as a surprise to me is the amount of time spent on promoting the program. It is my hope that parents and administrators understand art gives students the ability to take their knowledge and reach the highest level of inquiry and creativity. In my class the way to promote what I do starts with the students. I feel that much time is spent in the schools with literacy, but visual literacy is just as important for a 21st century thinker. The students learn art is a form of communication. They tell stories about themselves through their art. They also make others aware of social issues and understand visual images that are in our everyday lives. My dream is that when these children become parents they will pass on the knowledge and importance of art.

I strongly believe all students have the ability to evaluate, respond and perceive in life. Art allows the students to explore these skills. Giving the students a safe and open environment is important to help them investigate their ideas through critical thinking and problem solving skills.

Assessment of the students and my teaching is important. Evaluating the students' process with each lesson helps validate what I do. However, more specifically it allows me to evaluate what the students have accomplished and gives them some idea of where they can grow. Teaching art


has helped me become stronger as a person and in turn has helped my students become stronger in the world."

The work that Jenn has inspired her students to produce over the years is a testiment to her living and practicing her philosophy. Her students' work has been displayed at Arthur Roads Elementary School in an annual Art Show consisting of over 2000 pieces of work. Her students work has also been proudly displayed in Columbus for the annual YAM show. Within the community she has displayed her students' work at the Solon City Hall, at Case Western Reserve in their artist gallery, and on Channel 3's Weekend Morning Show.

Beyond the classroom Jenn is a constant advocate for the arts and her fellow art colleagues through her work on the Solon Welfare and Finance Committee, her work on the Resolutions Committee for the Solon Union, and acting as the Building Representative for the Solon Union. She is also a member of the Solon Visual and Performing Arts Boosters Club and Chair on their Performance Committee.

To challenge herself professionally beyond the classroom Jenn has taught the after school program at the Solon Center for the Arts, been a Felt making session instructor for Crayola Dream Maker's National K-6 Art Exhibition, and demonstrated and involved the public in felt making and its history for the Taste of Stow, Aurora One Fund and at open houses on an Alpaca farm.

You will find Jenn residing in Solon, OH with her loving husband and two wonderful daughters who patiently and willingly support Jenn in all of her work. Thank you Thompson family. OAEA, the Solon Schools and all of the Solon art students are better because of your gracious contributions.

Change can be difficult at times but when we are in the trenches together sometimes it doesn't seem so bad.






Northwest Region by Dawn Murphy Regional Director

Ohio Alliance for Arts Education Announces New Research Opportunity

The Ohio Alliance for Arts Education (OAAE) recently launched a research effort to measure arts education in

Ohio's schools. The OAAE, along with its partners the Ohio Arts Council (OAC) and Ohio Department of Education (ODE), will distribute the Ohio Arts Education Survey to school principals statewide on March 15, 2010.

Art educators can support the Ohio Arts Education Survey by 1) encouraging their principal to respond; 2) offering to assist the principal; and 3) thanking their principal upon completion and submission of the survey!

The information collected through the surveys will build on prior studies carried-out between 1989 and 2004 and will create a snapshot of the current status of arts education in Ohio's schools. OAAE and its partners will provide parents, school leaders, policy makers, and community members with an analysis of arts education while at the same time providing schools and communities with tools and resources to strengthen student learning. Lauren Hess, President of OAAE commented, "Our ultimate goal is to ensure that every child receives an education that develops imagination and builds 21^{st} century skills – and the arts provide the tools to accomplish that goal."

Quadrant Arts Education Research has been selected to lead the data collection and analysis. "We are honored to be able to assist Ohio on this crucial project for arts education," commented Bob Morrison of Quadrant Arts Education Research. "Access to arts education has never been more important." Quadrant has an extensive background working in other states on similar statewide arts education research.

The results of the Ohio Arts Education Survey will be previewed in late summer with a final report presented in the fall of 2010. The survey results will help the project partners and Ohio's learning community understand the impact of Ohio's arts education programs, the level of student involvement with the arts, and how to align resources to areas of need. The ultimate beneficiary of this work will be Ohio's students!

Resources to support this effort are provided by the Ohio Alliance for Arts Education, Ohio Arts Council, and Ohio Department of Education.


