

# In Memory of James K. Mateer

James K. Mateer, better known as Jim, was one of the founding fathers of the Ohio Art Education Association (OAEA) and was one of the first inductees into the OAEA Distinguished Fellows in 1991. Jim was an Ohio native, born and raised in Girad, Ohio where he graduated from High School in 1948. His career began at the Carnegie Institute of Technology. In 1953 he graduated from the Cleveland Art Institute. Jim served in the U.S. Army for two years and was stationed in Germany for thirteen months. Perhaps this is where Jim obtained his taste for really good beer! When he returned to the states, he attended Western Reserve University where he received his B.S. and M.A. in Art Education in 1958. Jim taught in Lorain County with the Midview Local School District for nineteen years and in 1977 became the Art Supervisor for Elyria Schools, a position he held until he retired in 1987.



Jim was also a part-time instructor for Lorain County Community College for twenty years. Upon his retirement from public education, Jim became an Adjunct Professor of Art Education at Baldwin College for the next seventeen years. Through these years of dedication to Art Education, it came as no surprise that he would be a leader in numerous arts organizations and hold various offices within these groups.

He was the President of the OAEA and The Ohio Alliance for Arts Education (OAAE). Jim was a caring man that lead in an intuitive style. His leadership and expertise could summarize and finalize conflict and concerns in a mater of minutes and always with his signature laugh and smile. It seemed so easy when Jim was around! He had that way of making the most difficult problems surmountable and manageable. Jim was called upon numerous times to lend his expertise. We were all better people because of Jim. He made the world a better place by just being Jim! He had a talent for being a people person!

Jim's talents extended beyond the classroom and academia. Jim continued to produce and receive recognitions for his own art. He used a variety of media but was probably best known for his work in colored pencil and block print. He performed in and attended theater productions that left an impact on cast, crew and audience alike. His theater talents and taste for the dramatic was evident in all that he did. His spacious studio in Wellington served as a working studio and a social gathering place for family and friends. The door was always open, just stop by and enjoy the hospitality. Jim's greatest treasures beyond his artwork were his family, friends, and an occasional party thrown in for good measure!

On Saturday, January 8, 2011 a number of OAEA Members said farewell during a Memorial Service in Wellington, Ohio to the man that will be remembered to some as Santa Claus. Former OAEA President, Sherrie Dennis remembers Jim earning this nick name during a conference some years back due to his love for fun and his distinctive laugh! We all will have many fond memories of Jim and stories to tell.....but we will never be able to tell a story like Jim did!

My name is Makiah Maxson-Seifert. I've been teaching art for four years, the past two with Lancaster City Schools.

My position is a bit of a nomadic one. I teach an Art 1 class first period in one room then move to another classroom to teach two more at Lancaster High School. In the afternoon I travel to Thomas Ewing Junior High where I teach three, sixth grade art classes in a room I share with another art teacher.

It's really easy to make a long list when I was told to write about issues I face as an art educator. I'm sure every teacher can make a list of things they'd like to change about their school, but I have a positive attitude.

The art department within my district has made positive and progressive improvements, behind the times as they may be. Three years ago the junior highs began offering art to all sixth grade students and one section for eighth grade. Our high school department has implemented specialty classes such as Printmaking, Painting, Portfolio Development and Advanced Explorations.

My district does not offer elementary art. It never has. However, many elementary classroom teachers care about teaching art, and will contact the art department on what to teach and how to do it. Unfortunately, this presents a challenge when students reach sixth grade—their first class with Art specialists. It's challenging to adhere to state standards according to grade level when prior knowledge is lacking. This is not to say we don't have talent in Lancaster, Ohio, because we do!

With the many challenges art teachers nationwide are faced with, I can say that personally, I'm thankful to be in a career I love. There is a lot I want to change, but then, that's why I'm an educator.

Power to the Arts Makes All Learning Meaningful Innovation, stArts


What I found over the last 15 years of teaching is I stand for three things: Arts Education advocacy, serving my own inner artist, and inspiring others to love learning through art.






