




- Gather your resources for your latest and greatest ideas for the classroom and submit your proposal now!
- Being a workshop presenter means you are a leader at your conference and you must be there! This will help your case! Meet Face-to-Face with your principal
- DO: make an appointment to meet with your principal RIGHT NOW, in the Spring of 2012! Let them know that you want to talk about professional development opportunities for next year that will benefit all the students in your school.
- DON'T: drop in on them unannounced to pop the question. This will put them on the defensive and make them feel like they have to answer you immediately. Scheduling a meeting will ensure that your principal has the time reserved to hear your entire case.
- DON'T: wait until the Fall of next school year to meet with your administration! Meeting this year will give them the time to get you on their budget for next year no excuses!
 - DON'T: assume that you will be denied requests because you have been denied in the past. Each year is a new budget with a different number of staff members requesting funds.
 - DO: prepare for your meeting. Print out the resources from the OAEA website and prepare the points on WHY you should attend the conference. Ask your principal to take some time and give it some consideration before giving you an answer.

Try other sources for support: After going through all the steps above with your principal, did you still get a "No?"

- Curriculum Coordinator: In every district, there is a curriculum coordinator that oversees the administration of the Art curriculum. This administrator also has a budget for professional development. Use the same steps as above to make your case.
- PTO/ PTA: The parent/teacher organizations in your school often have a budget for special requests. Quite often professional development conferences are an example of special fund usage. Check out this resource and use the above steps to make your case.
- Grant moneys: There are numerous organizations (OEA & NEA are two) that offer grants to teachers who are interested in seeking professional development. Considering the costs of some of these opportunities, our state conference is a great value for these organizations and should be an easy YES!
- Get creative! Seek out administrators with whom you have a good working relationship and ask for their advice on how to go about acquiring support for professional development. Ask advice from some of the classroom teachers you know that have been approved for professional development opportunities.

Prepare to have a sub early

- By attending the OAEA Professional Development Conference, your students will benefit greatly! Sacrifice short-term satisfaction for long-term success.
 - Research now and get together your best ideas for sub plans there are many great resources online!
- Prepare your students from the start to be independent! It's good for them to be independent without you from time to time. Register online early
- Regardless of who will be paying your conference fees, lock in your Early Bird Registration fee by registering yourself online ASAP.
- You DO NOT NEED TO PAY WITH CREDIT CARD to register online. Just check the "paying with check" box to complete your registration and send the check in later, when the funds are available.
- Whether you are writing your own check, writing your own check to be reimbursed by your district, getting a check from your district, paying with your own credit card, or paying with your district's credit card, REGISTER ONLINE EARLY!

Professional Development: Be Organized, Be Aware

Welcome to another exciting fall season. As you work to get your place of employment organized, don't forget to do the same for your professional life. Take time to review your professional goals, especially if they were approved more than two years ago. Set aside two hours; pour yourself a warm beverage and download the forms needed to attain local approval for the professional growth you have already completed. Fill out the paperwork and submit the forms to your local IPDP for approval.

Taking the time to track your professional development credits serves two purposes:

Being aware of the number of credits you have earned toward licensure renewal helps you to better plan for the hours remaining.

Reading about your professional life allows you to feel great about the work you are already doing!

You are encouraged to attend the OAEA Professional Development Conference. If your employer will allow, it is well worth the time to attend the entire three days. If your budget is limited, then make conference a road trip and attend just on Saturday. No matter how long you can stay, the OAEA Conference is well worth the professional time and money. Join us: get credit and become inspired!

Conference attendees have two ways to earn the Professional Development Units (PDUs) needed for licensure:

Earn one semester University of Dayton graduate credit or OAEA will certify up to three standard PDUs

What is the difference between these two PDU options?

Education professionals working toward a master's degree, or master's + 30, may want to attend all three days of the conference and then register their time with the University of Dayton to receive college credit. UD offers one semester credit to OAEA members for \$175. If you are interested in receiving credit, visit http://www.oaea.org, look for Professional Development, and then, Earning College Credit. Download a .pdf of the college registration form* and follow the instructions. Bring completed forms to the registration area for certification on November 10, 2012 from 3 - 5 p.m. UD will contact registered members for payment, after the Conference.

While most educators need PDUs to renew or upgrade their license, not all educators need college credit. To apply for OAEA Standard Professional Development Units, visit http://www.oaea.org, Professional Development, and look for Earning PDUs. OAEA will certify up to three PDUs for full Conference attendees and one PDU for being a workshop presenter (one PDU per same workshop). Forms can be printed from the website. *Bring completed forms to the registration area for certification on November 10, 2012 from 3 - 5 p.m.

There will be an overview of current trends in education, information about standards, assessment, and instruction. The session will provide the focus for the re-DESIGN-ing ARTS EDUCATION workshop series, the assessment rubrics to be used during attendance at selected sessions, and the simple procedure for earning a certificate for successful completion (ten hours of instructional time) of the high quality professional development opportunity.

Friday, November 9 -- Attend two designated workshop sessions presented by the Ohio Alliance for Arts Education:

- 1. Curriculum Integration Works (Friday morning)

Attend two *additional* workshops during the conference using the *new* Ohio Academic Content Standards in visual art as a lens for selecting workshop topics.


Before December 17 -- Participants will submit a post-conference written reflection. The participants will respond to guided questions and submit the reflection via email to Donna Collins. Reflections will be assessed by the OAAE Professional Development Team using a rubric. A Reflection rating of Exemplary or Satisfactory completes the <u>re-DESIGN-ing ARTS EDUCATION</u> requirement.

Participants who have completed the requirements of this in-depth, focused professional development experience will receive a certificate from the Ohio Alliance for Arts Education verifying attainment of the high quality professional development series – <u>re-DESIGN-ing ARTS EDUCATION</u> for ten hours of instructional time.

Art Educators planning to register for the re-DESIGN-ing ARTS EDUCATION workshop series opportunity should:

- 1. Register for <u>re-DESIGN-ing ARTS EDUCATION</u> by checking the box on the Conference Pre-Registration form. You must pre-register to attend.
- 2. Update their Individual Professional Development Plan to include the Ohio Alliance for Arts Education re-DESIGN-ing ARTS EDUCATION workshop series and submit their plan to their local Professional Development Committee for approval **PRIOR** to attending the conference.

THURSDAY, November 8th

- Don't miss this rare opportunity to explore one of Cincinnati's national historic landmarks as you go *Behind the Scenes at the Cincinnati Museum Center*. Docents will guide you through this unique Art Deco masterpiece, explaining its construction, architecture, and art, including the world-famous mosaic murals. 





National Board Certified Teachers by Judy Flamik

All National Board Certified Teachers who meet the requirements below are eligible for the Lead Professional Educator License. The requirements are: master's degree, nine years under a standard teaching license or certificate, of which at least five years are under a professional/permanent license/certificate or senior professional educator license, and demonstration of effective practice at the distinguished level of performance defined in the Ohio Standards for the Teaching Profession, specifically, by holding active National Board Certification, OR, successful completion of the Master Teacher portfolio and the Teacher Leader Endorsement.

Completing the National Board certification enables school districts to use performance as a criteria when making decisions regarding teacher tenure. Receiving certification is one of the only ways teachers can demonstrate teaching excellence and leadership, with measurable results. It can advance your career and, in some areas, increase your earning potential. It also provides portability; many states recognize National Board Certification as sufficient proof for state licensure, allowing you to move from state to state without having to obtain basic teaching credentials for each state.

The Take One option is a great way to decide if meeting National Board Certification is for you. Learn about the pros and cons of becoming an NBCT at our November Conference.

A reminder to all NBCTs: use every opportunity to promote your NBCT credentials. Put the NBCT logo on all your handouts and correspondence.

The 'speak out' will conclude by reconvening the large group to hear major 'speak out' points of how each group identifies and constructs connections among teaching, learning, and research in their practice.

I look forward to these sessions and to seeing what others present this year. Until then, I wish all of us a happy start to the school year, and I'll see you in November!

Second Call for OAEA Officer Nominations

The OAEA announces a call for nominations for Second Vice President and Secretary. The terms for these positions begin January 1, 2013. Below is a summary of the qualifications for each position.

The major responsibility for the Second Vice President is to serve as the Chair of the PR/Advocacy committee and be an active member of OAEA Executive Committee. It is the duty of the Secretary to maintain a complete record of all meeting of the Association, to distribute the minutes of each meeting at least two weeks prior to the next following meeting, and be an active member of the OAEA Executive Committee.

Nominations and self-nominations may be made to the Chair of the OAEA Nominating Committee (current OAEA Past President) by any of the following three ways:

- 1. By written declaration of intent by the candidate which shall be sent to the Chair of the Nominating Committee by October 28, 2012.
- 2. By nomination "from the floor" of the OAEA Annual Conference Business Meeting during Saturday lunch meeting, November, 10, 2012, if the nominator has the consent of the nominee.
- 3. By nomination by the Nominating Committee.

Electronic voting will take place following the 2012 Conference.


