##### Thursday Awards Dinner & Ohio Art Educator of the Year Keynote Speaker

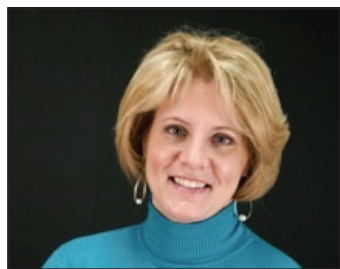

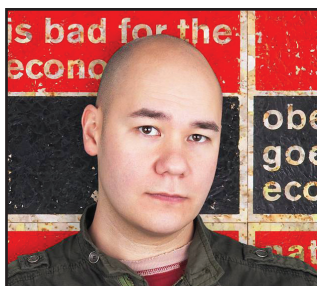
## Friday Afternoon

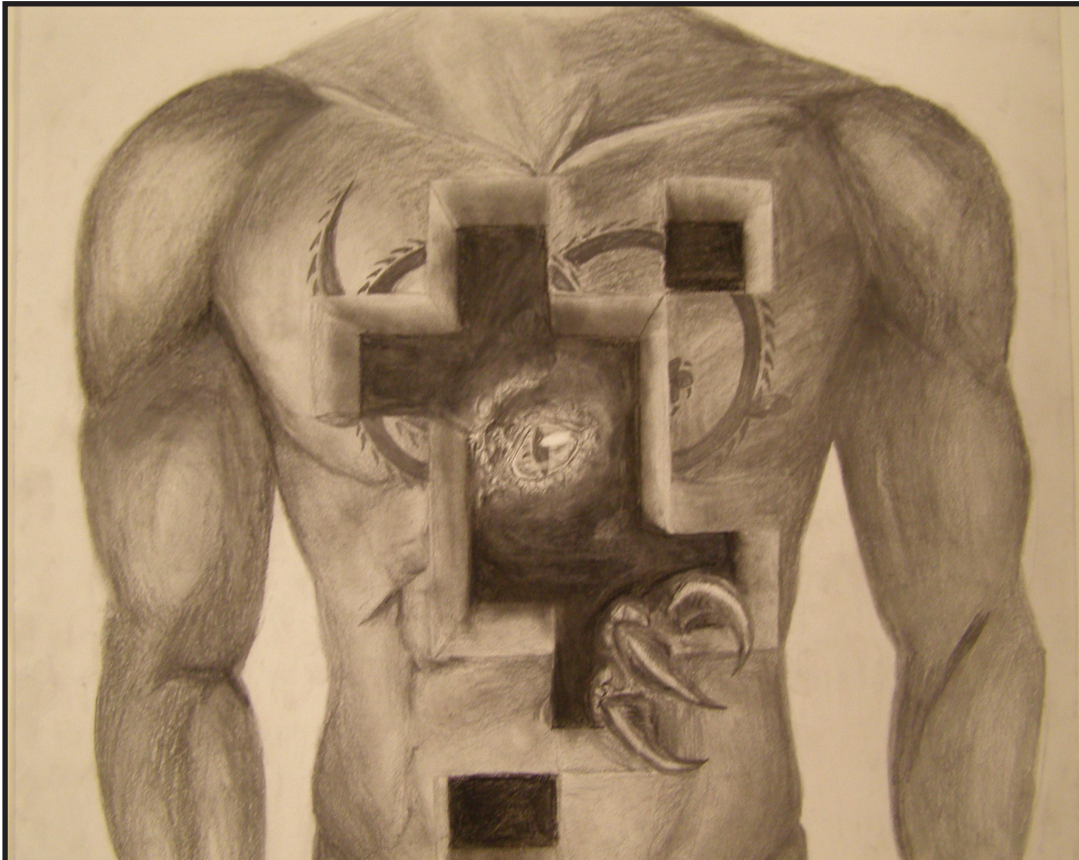

OTES and Teacher Collaboration: Showing Others What We Know

This is the first year that Ohio art teachers will be formally evaluated on their ability to show student growth in the visual arts. Please keep in mind that you are not alone in this process.

OTES: Nancy Pistone (ODE) has been a strong advocate for the new evaluation system, leading workshops throughout the state. In August, Nancy and Cam McComb led a daylong workshop that focused on helping art teachers understand the new evaluation system. The one thing that teachers need to keep in mind is that before they begin to track student growth, they need to know what abilities students possess, before instruction. This means that art teachers need to take one or more class periods to have students create artwork that establishes a baseline for their data.

Collaboration: Assessment is best done when working in collaboration with others. Mandy Howard and Cam McComb have been actively working with colleagues in South-Western City Schools, along with Jessimi Jones at the Columbus Museum of Art, to create broad and effective assessment rubrics. If you need assistance in knowing how to approach your assessment process, please contact [mandy.howard@swcs.us](mailto:mandy.howard@swcs.us) and we will be happy to share information or include you in our collaborations.

Exhibition: Data is best understood when displayed in a visual way. To this end, visual arts teachers are poised to help all teachers of non-tested subjects to best exhibit student growth results to students, parents, and administrators. ## Professional Development

The air is turning cooler and it's time to get organized: for school as well as for our professional growth and development. And the arrival of fall also means the excitement of another OAEA Professional Development Conference! This is our opportunity to get energized with new ideas, reconnect with old friends and celebrate the power of art in our and our students' lives.

Attending the Conference offers two ways to earn Professional Development Units (PDUs) you need for licensure. You can earn one semester graduate credit from the University of Dayton or up to 2.5 PDUs certified through OAEA. To decide what is the best approach for you consider the following:

### *University of Dayton graduate credit*

Education professionals working toward a master's degree, or a master's +30, may want to attend all two and a half days of the conference and then register their time with the University of Dayton to receive college credit. UD offers one semester credit to OAEA members for \$175.00. If you are interested in receiving credit, check out the OAEA website under Professional Development to find the .pdf of the college registration form. Simply follow the instructions provided. Bring the form to the registration area during the conference for certification on Saturday, November 16, from 10:30 a.m. – noon. After the conference, the University of Dayton will contact registered members for payment.

### *OAEA PDUs*

Most educators need PDUs to renew or upgrade their licenses. To apply for OAEA Standard Professional Development Units go to the OAEA website under Professional Development and look for Earning PDUs. OAEA will certify up to 2.5 PDUs for full conference attendees and one PDU if you are a workshop presenter (one PDU per workshop regardless of the number of times repeated). Print the form from the website and bring the completed form to the registration area for certification on Thursday or Friday, November 14 and 15, from 4 – 5pm or on Saturday, November 16, from 10:30 a.m. to noon.

Everything you do is your advocacy. Think about that.

Become more aware of your own actions and practice as an art educator. Your actions inform your parents, administrators, and community about the value of your field. Every action counts. Conversely, every missed-action makes a statement too. What is your advocacy practice?

I learned a great deal about advocacy while representing you at the NAEA Western Region Leadership Conference in Oklahoma City in June. There is so much I'd like to share with you through this publication, electronically, and face-to-face at the conference in Toledo. Barbara Gabel, NAEA Past-President says that we need to "stop being helpless" and get organized. We need to know our beliefs, set our agenda, and stick to it. Jennifer James, a professional advocate in Oklahoma, described what advocacy is NOT. It is neither opinions nor emotions. Connect research to your message. Sandy Cotton, Development Director for the OKC Museum of Art and her husband, Art, (no joke, that's his name) coached us how to identify, cultivate, solicit, and (most importantly) sustain prospects for whatever kind of support we seek. Oklahoma Senator Constance Johnson reminds us to be polite, be early, and be in touch when building relationships. Advocacy is building relationships, after all. There is so much more to share, and I will.

Everything you do is your advocacy. Not just newsletter articles, website postings, and a big art festival. It's more, not all big things, but a continuous string of little things. Your lesson plans inform your administrators about quality art education. Give your administrators "looking points" for their visits. Your district endowment grant applications are your advocacy. You are informing your community members of the potential depth you can take your students with their support. People know what goes on in your classroom through what you regularly do or share.

Make an advocacy plan for the year. September has Arts in Education Week. March is Youth Art Month. April sees Arts Advocacy Day. What about the rest of the year? Don't let the string break. Prepare a "leave piece" for Open House with three bullet points and your contact information. Present the Ohio Revised Standards to your administrators or board personally and offer to discuss the changes. Include our Toledo Conference Friday Night Super Session in your advocacy plan. Bring your own pre-washed (cotton) item to screenprint. Might I suggest printing something for your advocacy prospects?

Everything you do is your advocacy. What are your actions saying? I'll see you in Toledo.
